



Health Genetic Warranty

We, the seller/breeder, certify that the puppy you, the buyer, purchased is in sound health at the time of sale to the best of our knowledge and has been given all vaccinations and worming's stated on the vaccination record provided to you. We have done our best to provide you with a healthy puppy. You will be responsible for further vaccinations and boosters.

The following stipulations must be adhered to for the replacement to be made. Official reports from 2 unaffiliated veterinarians state that, without a doubt, the puppy has a life-threatening genetic defect. These must be made available or sent to us along with the phone numbers of each vet's office. In the event of the puppy's death, an autopsy **MUST BE DONE** by a licensed veterinarian stating the cause of death. The documentation must be forwarded to us before a determination will be made.

We, the seller/breeder, reserve the right to confirm the diagnosis with a veterinarian of their choice. We will not be responsible for any expenses you may incur, including shipping and veterinarian expenses. This warranty applies only to the original buyer. Warranty is for the puppy replacement or credit for the future puppy only.

We cannot control the exposure your puppy encounters after the sale. Puppies sometimes get stressed when they are adopted and move to their new home. This stress can be brought on due to the move, change in diet, too much handling, not enough quiet time, or not eating properly. This stress can also bring on things that are dormant such as but not limited to worms, ear mites, colds, hypoglycemia, and/or coccidiosis, and/or giardiasis. These conditions are all treatable and do not warrant a replacement. There is no guarantee on the color or size of the puppy now or as an adult.

The following are not covered by this guarantee:

- Breed Characteristics
- Reimbursement for veterinary expenses
- Reimbursement for air transport or return
- External Parasites such as ticks, fleas, or ear mites
- Internal Parasites such as an intestinal worm or their effects (almost every puppy has some sort of intestinal worms). Although we have wormed your puppy regularly, it only takes a few days for them to pick up another “batch”. This is just a part of puppy-hood, which is why a regular worming schedule is recommended.

Please be aware that as a new puppy owner you share a responsibility to help prevent hip dysplasia as it has been proven to be part of heredity and increasing environment.

We strongly recommend, but do not require, that your puppy be spayed and neutered. It is your ultimate responsibility to take good care of your puppy and provide adequate food, water, shelter, and veterinarian care. We have bred this puppy based on sound stock. Through proper diet, exercise, and quality living conditions, you can play an important role in helping your puppy grow into a healthy adult.
